New Agency Headquarters

In October 2020, Haven House Services purchased a 14,419 SF building located at 1008 Bullard Court in Raleigh. After renting our main program offices for nearly five decades, we are excited to finally have a permanent home. Significant renovations are transforming the building into the perfect facility for our programs, staff, and most importantly, the youth and families we serve.

We distributed **85** backpacks for youth in need for the 2020-2021 school year.



100 volunteers plus our staff raised funds for our programs with a record-breaking Annual Campaign.



We provided **3,378** hours of counseling, therapy, mentoring, and case management services via telehealth and in-person sessions.



Street Outreach program acquired a mobile van. Distributed **306** hygiene kits & **413** snack bags and made 1,244 referrals for youth to needed services.



We expanded our Transition in Place apartment program and our Street Outreach program to serve more youth experiencing homelessness.

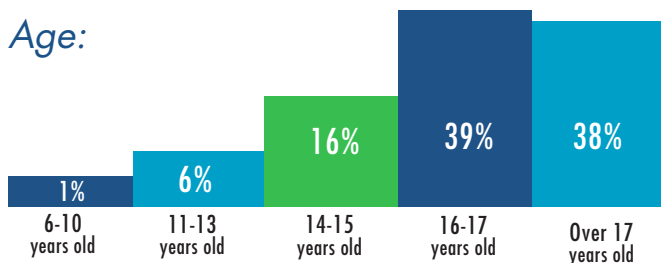

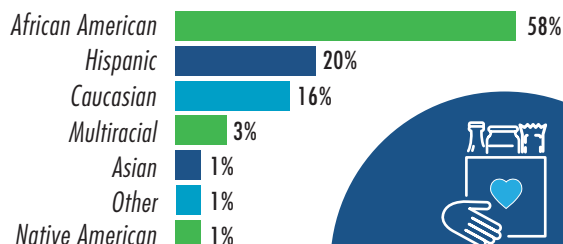
